From the Interim Pastor: Holy Emotions for Holy Times

But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see - I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." - Luke 2:10-12

I hope this past season of Thanksgiving has given you opportunity to reflect on the goodness of your life, the many ways you are blessed and the depth of the gratitude that reverberates within your soul at all times. Gratitude is right there at the heart of Christian joy, which flows through us whenever we are touched by the grace of God's abundant love.

Christmas, which is soon upon us, is often associated with joy. However, it seems to me that the most appropriate and important experience of our hearts at Christmas is not joy, but wonder. For what we celebrate on Christmas day is the most awesome miracle we know – God with us as one of us. This incomprehensible miracle – that a helpless, vulnerable baby could be God the Almighty Creator and Sustainer of the universe and of life – must surely produce in us wonder and awe as we ponder the unfathomable implications of this for our own life. Christian joy is, perhaps, more fitting as our response to the events we celebrate at Easter, when the meaning of the miracle of Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection is revealed.

But for now, even before the miracle of Christmas, we enter Advent – the time of anticipation, hope, and patient waiting. Much of our life is just that. As gratitude, wonder and joy are experienced by us throughout the whole year, is not hope also constantly with us? Our future is never empty, but always full. As you read this, you are anticipating many things. They may include visits from family, gifts to give and receive, Christmas cards, travel, shopping, sharing special meals, worshipping in candlelight, donating to church and other charities, listening to Christmas carols, a few days off from work, and sitting by the fire.

All of these are beautiful blessings from God, and are gifts to be appreciated and to fill our hearts as well as our days. This year, as you anticipate and live through each of these things, may they remind you of your deeper anticipations and the hope Christ came to fulfill – absolute peace and love and joy for yourself, for all individuals and for the whole world. We do experience this peace and love and joy from time to time. But we also continue to ponder and to wonder as we wait for it, living in pregnant expectation.

May this Advent and Christmas season be filled, for you, with gratitude, hope, peace, love, joy and wonder. And may they pass through you and beyond you to all who are near you.

Searching for the New Pastor

You may be surprised, or you may say, "That's true!" but everything in it came out of the surveys you did back in September.

What's next? The Nominations Committee will be taking names of people wishing to be on the search and picking some five to seven. Search committee members should be ready to drive or fly to faraway places, they must be available for lots of meetings, and they will have to take criticism no matter who the pastor turns out to be, even if it is St. Paul himself.
