Nancy has been a guest minister at the Old Whalers Church in Sag Harbor for several months-she has also been guest minister at the New Thought Center in Watermill, the Unitarian Universalist Meetinghouse in Bridgehampton and in Union Chapel in Shelter Island. Nancy has her Bachelors' Degree in Music Therapy, her Masters degree in Special Education and holds an Advanced Certificate as a Children's Lit Fellow from Stony Brook University. Nancy is a retired teacher from Sag Harbor Elementary School. She writes a column for the Sag Harbor Express entitled 'Home', she created the Songwriters Share Charity Concert Series and is also a singer/songwriter with four original CD's to her credit. In 1989 Nancy was awarded the Suffolk County Performing Artist of the Year.
