CROP Walk

Church World Services, the sponsor of the CROP Walk, has been around for 75 years. They have helped thousands of people in 66 countries including our own. Just this past year they resettled 1500 refugees, supported 1600 food banks, and distributed 76,000 kits including blankets, hygiene, and school supplies around the world. They were there for Haiti and its earthquake, and they are in Ukraine now.

Groups such as churches contributed \$6.5 million, of which our contribution was \$2700. Every year, 25% of what we raise comes back to us in the form of a donation to the Immaculate Conception food bank. Less than 7% of the money goes to run the organization, a very low per cent compared to many so-called charities. Your dollar is really useful!

So find a walker to fund or walk yourself, or do both. There is no better use of your charitable dollars, and there is a real feeling of satisfaction to walking in crisp fresh air for two miles. There is also a shorter walk and one longer, but most people walk with us to St. Marks and back. Remember, Sunday, October 16 after church. See Stu Wood for questions and donation forms.
