A Word from your Pastor

Now that the excitement of Easter is over and we are headed toward summer, some of you may be wondering—what next? We have just celebrated Jesus' resurrection which is the ultimate reminder that God loves us. If Jesus the Christ was able to overcome death for us, then God must love us. And if God loves us, then God is still concerned about us today. This is all great news, and I'm sure most of you have heard it before.

Some of you have spent a lot of time in church over the past few weeks—Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the sunrise and regular services on Easter Sunday. You've heard this good news of death and resurrection of Jesus and you understand what it means for you today, in the near future, and forever. This is all amazing and important, but it doesn't quite answer the question of what we do with all of this faith that we've so freshly gained. Do we hide it under a bush? Oh no! It's our time to shine.

Thank you for supporting "Otchiy Dim", a ministry that serves many children who were deprived of parental care and implements many directions of service to those in need.












1st QUARTER 2023 FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT


The 1st quarter 2023 ended on a positive note for the financial health of our church. The year-to-date pledge goal is \$63,657 and the year-to-date actual giving is \$82,423, which means we have a positive difference between goal and actual of \$18,766. This is very encouraging and very much needed to keep our church's financial health on track.



The church's 1st quarter actual income year-to-date total is now \$121,910 and expenses \$117,170, which means the year-to-date difference between income and expense to \$4,740.



Our budgeted payment to the Presbytery for 2023 is a total of \$12,174. In the 1st quarter our Per Capita income was \$4,013, which means our church right now would need to compensate \$8,161 for members who have not yet contributed their Per Capita. We would like to ask you for your Per Capita contribution of \$43.95, as it will greatly help our church to finance other activities. We thank you in advance!



Our church is blessed by your contributions, your support and all the volunteers who add to our financial stability. Hereby, we would like to express our sincere gratitude to all you!
