A Word from your Pastor

This summer, we are having a bible study entitled "Why Presbyterians are Like That." And for those of you in the study, you may have already heard some of this. But the question remains—what makes Presbyterians special? What makes them different or similar to other denominations? Can you answer those questions? Don't feel badly if you can't, you are in good company! Each church has its own unique composition and perspectives and it's easy to forget the importance of other churches in our presbytery and around the nation. So, what makes us the way that we are?

First, Presbyterians affirm what is laid out in the Nicene and Apostles Creeds. The main points of these creeds are the following:

God created the heavens and earth

Jesus had a human mother like all of us

Jesus was uniquely related to God

Jesus lived an exemplary life

Jesus was unjustly betrayed and executed

Jesus was resurrected on Easter and remains our living Lord.

Of course, there is a great variety in the beliefs of Presbyterians across the country, and we are not the only Christians who emphasize these elements of faith, but we distinguish ourselves by the ways in which we live out our particular beliefs.

In addition to the beliefs outlined in these creeds, there are elements of faith on which Presbyterians have a particular stance.

The Bible—we believe studying the Bible prayerfully and together helps us figure out which things matter more than other things.

Grace happens—it is given freely by God and there is nothing on Earth we can do to earn God's grace.

God's grace invites our response—God's unconditional love invites and empowers us to respond gratefully to God's grace through worship and serving others.

God gave us brains and expects us to use them—we believe nothing in the Bible ever calls or requires us to pretend we don't know the things we actually do know about science, literature, history or anything else.

We are beloved, gifted, capable, and safe. Already. Right now.

God calls us to be on the side of the ones who are having the hardest time.

Nobody is perfect

There's more Holy Spirit in a bunch of us than in any single one of us.

God isn't finished but continues to respond to human sin by loving, calling, pursuing, empowering, and inspiring us to live with hope in a world where sin and death are real.

So, what do you think? Does this fit in with your beliefs and understanding of God and our church? In what ways is it similar or different? The statements above are not meant to be the end of the conversation, but the start.






Finance Committee Update

Dear friends,

We are reaching the half year mark of 2023 and we thought it would be of importance to inform you about the financial health of our church, especially how our actual numbers look versus the budget 2023.

The cumulative May pledge goal was \$106,095 and the May actual giving is \$114,395, which means we have a slight positive difference between goal and actual of \$8,300. As it can be seen in the graphic below the giving's took a dip and have not been as strong from the start of the year.

We would like to encourage any church member who pledged to please check for the current giving's status versus pledge. Any giving increase is highly appreciated and of utmost support for our church!



Pledges - Givings

The church's May actual income year-to-date total is now \$215,256 and expenses \$195,505, which means the year-to-date difference between income and expense to \$18,752. However, we must realize that within the stated income is a \$50,000 support funding from the Memorial & Endowment Fund, which means our income would only be \$165,256 and we would be \$30,000 in the red.


This means that the financial health of our church is not as we all would like to see it and it may get worse as the remaining M&E support is only another \$12,520. Just as an example, last year May we did not use any M&E support and our cumulative net income was at a healthy \$21,152.

Below graphics shows the average expense versus income, which showed a positive deviation of income versus expenses in most of the years. However, utilizing a run rate for 2023 and average the run, one can see that this year will be an undesirable financial outcome for our church with the potential need to tap deeper into our M&E reserves.



All of us do not want to have this happen, therefore we would like to ask you to review your current giving's versus your pledge or your ability to donate to our church to gain a better financial health for our church. We all are under the constraints of higher inflation rates and economic uncertainties, but if you can support in any way, it would be highly appreciated!
