

A Word from your Pastor

It's Stewardship season and most of you will be receiving a letter shortly asking you to consider what your pledge may be for the coming year. As you do that, there's a few things I'd like to clear up in regards to our church and its finances based on information from our financial team and recent financial reports. **Myth #1: We live in a wealthy community, there must be plenty of people giving large amounts.** Many people are exceedingly generous with the church, the largest group giving between \$1,000 and \$5,000 per year. Once we get to gifts more than \$5,000, we are in the single digits of pledges (that means less than 10). This is not to say we are not incredibly grateful for gifts of these amounts, but it would be incorrect to say that we have a solid base of people giving large amounts of money. Remember that as large as \$5,000 sounds, it breaks down to \$416/month. The average expenses of our church monthly averages to \$38,789.66 based on the year so far. If you have any questions about pledging or would like a statement to show what you may still owe for this year, please contact the church office.

Myth #2: We have a large endowment so that will keep us going.

We do have a wonderful endowment due to the forward thinking and dedicated people who have given to it. However, this is not piles of money sitting in a bank account, it is invested funds on which we receive interest. For the endowment to stay sustainable, we need to be drawing 3-4% interest each year. This year, we have drawn 7% and we are not at the year's end. In addition, the endowment has many restricted funds (mainly in scholarship) that cannot be used for general operating expenses, capital projects, etc. We have an outstanding Memorial and Endowment Committee in place, but they can only manage the money well, not magically increase it.

Myth #3: We can just cut our expenses down to help.

As many of you know from personal experience, expenses have increased in the past few years. For example, our general insurance went from approximately \$24,000 to over \$32,000. Items such as insurance, oil, electricity and water are essentials and all have increased while most pledges have not. We understand that as expenses increase, it affects people's ability to give, but also be aware that the vast majority of pledges have not increased in the past two years. To cut expenses we are mainly looking at mission giving. Mission stands at the core of the church's purpose and it would be difficult to make the decision to reduce its funding.

None of this is to discourage you. You are wonderful, faithful, and generous people who give so much of your time, talent and money. This should not be seeen as a scolding, but rather seeks to open avenues of communication about the financial state of the church. The above myths are ones I mainly hear and I hope that you see something that might help you understand our situation better.

This pledging season I know you will once again generously open your hearts to the needs of the church, my prayer is that you do so prayerfully, thoughtfully, and knowledgeably.



The Deacon's closet became overstocked due to donations and returns of medical equipment. A major sorting and organization took place. We donated to the Ukrainian Aid another 7 walkers, 6 crutches, 6 rollators, 8 canes, 4 shower chairs, 1 tri rollator, 1 wheelchair, 1 transport chair, 7 commodes, 4 side (Hemi) walkers, 6 seat cushions and other medical equipment such as inflatable bed mattress to prevent bed sores.

After the purge, the lending closet still has walkers, wheelchairs, transport chairs, rollators, etc. In addition there is a step 2 bed and an upright walker as pictured.
