A Word from the Pastor

Spring has finally sprung! At the time I am writing this (March 20th) it is officially the first day of spring! I have always appreciated the changing of the seasons and been grateful to live in parts of our country where we get to experience all four of them. Springtime has always been one of my favorite seasons—the return of the light to our days and evenings, fresh flowers, the ability to spend more time outside.

King Solomon also loved springtime and writes about this in the "Song of Solomon" found in the Hebrew bible. He writes that it follows the long and cold, dark and wet winter and that it brings with it flowers with their fragrance and the promise of new experiences. If you are at all familiar with the Song of Solomon, you'll also know it is considered the most romantic book in the Bible and Solomon notes that springtime even provides an ideal time for romantic love (Song 2:13).

Spring is also a time of great promise. We know that the cold rain we often experience during this time will yield to warmer weather and is necessary for the coming of the flowers and plants that will bloom later on in the spring. Birds are beginning to return north for the summer and even if we can't hear all of their songs yet, we know that they are coming. Scientifically, we know why spring is arriving as the earth turns and brings us closer to the sun. But long before we understood exactly why, people have been celebrating the seasons and giving thanks to God for the beauty that accompanies them.

It is easy to complain about the sudden cold snaps and rainy days that may accompany early or mid-spring, but we are also reminded to give thanks to God for the rain that falls and the grass that grows (Psalm 147:7-8). We are reminded not to take these things for granted, even when it's colder than what we would like or the rain is preventing us from being outside as much as we'd like. Spring is also a reminder for us to not only emerge from our physical homes and warm spaces, but to open our hearts up once again. As we start preparations for the summer and all the busyness that goes along with it, take the time to pause and reflect on the many gifts we've been given. Westhampton Beach and its surrounding towns and villages are a beautiful and unique place to live and we are blessed to have such beauty around us. It's also a call to reach out to others who are also emerging from their winter-induced rest. What a wonderful time to meet with an old friend or pay a visit that you've been putting off.

Ancient people across the world would pause and give thanks for the coming of spring, when they could begin to plant the crops that would be needed for the coming year and for the return of warmer weather. These days we are much more able to mediate the effects of our environment, but it doesn't mean that we shouldn't take the time to stop and be grateful. Whatever springtime rituals you may have—cleaning up the leaves in the yard, planting bulbs and flowers—perhaps also take the time to recognize our place in the natural world and to give thanks for the opportunity to be within it.

Go for a walk with church companions on a hike led by Janet Hann, spend time walking on the beach or simply spend 5 minutes outside in the sunshine. God has given us so many gifts this spring, let us give thanks and rejoice in them.
