Theme

τὸ τί ἐστι this-ness (in Latin, haecceitas), what one has, the what-(it)-is-ness...

- ► Phonetic spelling: to ti esti
- (definition) a primary designation for philosophical concepts of essence or substance, it is analogous to concepts in English of essence or being...
- ► There are 2 occurrences in the NT: Luke 15:12 The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the <u>goods</u> that will belong to me.' So he divided his <u>goods</u> between them..."; and Luke 15:13 "A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country, and there he squandered <u>his</u> <u>substance</u> in dissolute living..."
- Reflection: It's essential that any Franciscan narrative convey an interpersonal encounter with God as well as a sense of authentic relationship, that is, a sense of being loved and accepted by God in the uniqueness of one's own 'this-ness' haecceitas one's own personhood.

"Haecceity" is a term from medieval scholastic philosophy, first coined by followers of Duns Scotus to denote a concept that he originated: the discrete qualities, properties or characteristics of a thing that make it a particular thing. It is a literal translation of the equivalent term in Aristotle's Greek to <u>ti esti (tò tí</u> <u>¿otl) or "the what (it) is"</u> and is most often translated into English as "this-ness" or "being".

For Franciscans, such a thisness (or, essence) is described as a gift from God to be called upon for the benefit of others. Our "thisness" individuates us and becomes the "touchstone" for continuing discernment throughout one's life — and, for Franciscans, that's likely no less than a cosmic encounter with Christ, in which everything that is real is created

and relates in and through the Mystery of God and the sacramental reality of creation. How do we discover our this-ness?

- Such theophanies are possible only when one acknowledges God's Mystery in the cosmic activity of the Books of Nature, Scripture, and Life.
- It's thereby properly understood as the operation of grace (divine favor), i.e. a grace-endowment to edify and sustain the very substance of creation.


