HAPPY 501H ANNIVERSARY



On December 15, 1974, the M. P. Möller pipe organ, a gift from Mrs. William Gill in memory of her late husband, was dedicated during an extended morning church service. Dr. Robert Baker, who at the time was the Director of Yale's Institute of Sacred Music, designed the organ and was the guest organist for the service. Over 350 people attended the dedication ceremony, which moved Rev. Thomas Truscott to comment "this may have been the finest hour in the 220-year history of the congregation."

Jump forward 50 years, and the Gill Memorial organ is still gracing our beloved Sanctuary and is an integral part of our Sunday worship services, as well as the weddings and funerals of the members and friends of the Westhampton Presbyterian Church.

In celebration of those 50 years, we will be rededicating the organ on December 15, 2024 during our morning worship service. We have invited former Westhampton Presbyterian Church organists Linda Howard-Kloepfer and William Roslak to perform during the service, and Kamilla and the choir will provide the Introit and a special anthem. Jamie Hulse Smith, retired organist from the Corning First Presbyterian Church, will also participate. Jamie, a former member of WPC, was one of Linda's organ students and learned to play on the Gill organ.





As you can imagine, it is not easy to

maintain such an impressive instrument. The cost of the tunings and maintenance for the organ and all three of the church and chapel pianos is over \$3000 annually. As part of the 50th anniversary celebration, we will be creating a Music Maintenance Fund to ensure that the care of the organ is always fully funded. There are special envelopes for you to make a donation in memory or honor of a loved one, and your donation will be recognized in the Organ Dedication Service bulletin on December 15. Additional donation envelopes will be available until December 8, or if you prefer, you can mail a donation to the church with your dedication information.



3rd QUARTER 2024 FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The 3rd quarter 2024 ended on a weak note for the financial health of our church.

The year-to-date pledge goal is \$194,994 and the year-to-date actual giving is \$192,524, which means we have a negative difference between goal and actual of -\$2,469. Unfortunately, the trend of weak givings manifested itself throughout the 2nd and 3rd quarter and we only achieved our monthly giving goal for 3 out of 9 months. Of 9 month which missed our giving goal, 4 were extremely low. We urge you to check your actual givings versus your annual pledge and check whether your givings meet your pledge. Thank you!



The church's 3rd quarter actual income year-to-date total is now \$334,109 and expenses \$314,566, which means the year-to-date difference between income and expense to \$19,544. This may look like a healthy difference, but we have to understand following background data to truly understand our income versus expense financials.


- 1. We received \$52,356 financial support from the Memorial & Endowment fund
- 2. We do not have a permanent pastor, which lowered the expense by around \$35,000

If we take these two factors into consideration, our income versus expense difference for our operating budget would be -\$67,812.


As mentioned, our giving level is below the pledge plan. Moreover, Loose Plate income is less than 50% of our plan and Building Use income only at 61% of plan. Donation Other were luckily supported by two major contributions and is at 87% of plan. The major contribution, way above plan, is Fundraising at 123% of plan. Fundraising is compensating for a lot of our income weaknesses. However, we cannot only rely on Fundraising but require fulfilling the largest income

items like Givings and Donation Others. It must be said that we often state that our church is very financially healthy, which is a much too positive viewpoint as we have been struggling to create a balanced operating budget and struggle to keep a positive cash flow without the support by the Memorial & Endowment Fund and Fundraising. This is not sustainable over the long-term!

Our expenses are a little below the planned expenses, at 72%. However, any unforeseen and unplanned expense can tip this balance.



Our budgeted mission payment to the Presbytery for 2024 is a total of \$12,116. In the 3rd quarter our Per Capita Mission giving was \$4,639, which means our church right now would need to compensate \$7,477 for the 72% of members who have not yet contributed their Per Capita Mission. We would like to ask you for your Per Capita contribution of \$43.95, as it will greatly help our church to finance other activities. We thank you in advance!



Our church is blessed by your contributions, your support and all the volunteers who add to our financial stability. Hereby, we would like to express our sincere gratitude to all you!
