#### A Word from the Pastor

Dear Friends.

With my background as an illustrator, I am always excited about the way the work of Christian artists, writers, composers and the like can deepen our understanding of the Good News. I mention a few personal favorites here with the hope you will incorporate some form of art in your devotions this Lent as well as in your plans for Easter and its own ensuing season.

First, Voltaire's *Les Miserables*. If you missed the wonderful musical recently at the high school (featuring WPC talent!) try listening to the sound track or reading the novel. When Jean Valjean experiences hospitality and forgiveness by Monseigneur Bienvenu, we have a beautiful example of how God's grace can transform a life. *Les Mis* is a moving tale and affirming of Christian hope.

If you like film, there are many excellent movies that shine a light on God's work in the world without being preachy. Clint Eastwood's *Gran Torino* is about the challenges of loving one's neighbor and the sacrifices we make for others; *True Grit* (with Jeff Bridges and Matt Damon) offers Biblical views of vengeance and justice in an absorbing plot. Going back a few years, *Trip to Bountiful* with Jessica Tandy deals with our human longing for the perfection of Eden. Good, family-oriented movies that illuminate the Christian faith are also out there, such as *Heaven is For Real*.

For music, there is so much available that it is hard to note one thing in particular, but a go-to for me is *Brahms Requiem* during Lent, and of course *Handel's Messiah* with the Hallelujah Chorus for Easter. The genius of this music gives expression to our deepest sorrows and highest joys.

For visual art, I highly recommend Rembrandt's *Return of the Prodigal* for a clear view of God's forgiveness. (Join us on April 9 for a study of this painting – details inside.) I also love Eugene Burnand's painting titled *The Disciples Peter and John*, which you may easily find online -- a beautiful depiction of the two men's race to the empty tomb on Easter morning.

As we spend this month in the promise of forgiveness in Christ, and receive the invitation to his resurrection life at Easter – the arts truly help our spirits take hold of these gifts. It is a marvel of creativity that the imagination of these artists is actually what makes God's love for us more real.
