"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." -Romans 15:13



For the month of July, anyone interested in outdoor fellowship while kayaking, biking or a simple picnic on the beach look for more information in the July/August Tidings.


Presbyterian Women,

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

Every once in a while something unforeseen happens in our church to one of our parishioners. I am writing this so people will know where the emergency equipment is located.

There is an AED located in the foyer of the parish hall on the wall across from the Men's Room. We own a manual blood pressure machine and it is now located in the same box as the AED. There is a wheelchair located in the entryway of the church on the Quogue (east) side.

A First Aid kit is located in the kitchen on the wall next to the exit to the deacon's closet.

Most of the time, there might be a medical professional in the building but if not, do not hesitate to call 911. The landline might be better as EMS can identify our location. Update from the Deacons Closet

Thanks to the overwhelming generosity of our members and friends, we were able to donate excess items from our Deacons closet to some very needy brothers and sisters.

We made two deliveries to S.I.L.O. located in Medford. (Self initiated living options). This organization enables people with disabilities to live independently and safely. The staff were very grateful for our donation as they can distribute our equipment to individuals to use for as long as needed. The medical equipment that they purchase through grants must be returned within a time period. Many thanks to Janet Hann and Kathy Dayton for assisting us with sorting, loading and delivering these items.

We were also able to make a large donation to the Ukraine. A sister church in Riverhead picked up the items and will ship them directly to the Ukrainian people. Again, thanks to Janet Hann for her continued work and support of this important ministry. And a shout out to Erika who is most often the person that fields the calls, and receives and lends out the equipment!

Please take note...we can no longer accept commodes and elevated toilet seats as these particular items are hardly ever requested. We can accept them if they are unused and in the box because then they can be shipped to the Ukraine
